I am sure you have been waiting with baited breath for the monthly BBT. Carol keeps everyone in line and is constantly thinking of ways to improve the running of this association.

Treasurer Les has been Treasurer for this association for many years but did not renominate to continue in this position. We welcome to this team Julie Jensen from Townsville.

Education Officers Warwick and Paula Armstrong, have had a busy year. The first outsiders to be nominated and accepted onto the Roundalab Board of Directors. What a fantastic achievement. Congratulations. I know this has added a lot to your workload but they have done a great job in organizing our Education Seminars at this convention and also at the Callers Cuers Conference. We are most appreciative of their efforts.

With such a wide area to cover we are extremely grateful for good old Skype.

What has ARDA achieved this year and what are we planning.

We have finalised

The implantation of a credit card for use by our Secretary rather than having to wait for transfer of petty cash reimbursements. Don't worry we will be keeping a close eye on its use in case Carol feels she needs some uplifting and a shopping spree is the remedy.

What are we hoping to achieve in the coming 10 months and beyond

- More interaction between our State Representatives and this committee eg. Reports from States and Territory to be available for our Executive meetings. We as an organization only get to hear what each State has achieved at our meetings here at the National Conventions. A suggestion was put to our State Representative that their report contain information about all Round Dance Groups in their area and not just restricted to the members of their association. These reports are presented at a National Convention and we would all love to hear of everyone's activities during the year.
- The finalization of the update of our Constitution and By Laws.
- Some changes to the National Convention By Laws to be submitted to the Board for their Consideration.

- The refurbishing of the ACCESS database so that our renewal forms are complete and up to date and we don't have to fill them in each year.
- The continuation of our seminars preceding the National Conventions and also the hope that we may be able to convince future National Convention Committees the importance of increasing the number of hours during the daytime to make it worth the while of round dancers (non square dancers) to attend National Conventions. At this Convention there are 30 additional delegates who would not under normal circumstances attended. Not a big number but that's approximately \$3,000 extra into the coffers with very little additional outlay. (Programmes, Pins and Ribbons) The halls had already been budgeted but were just used to their capacity.
- Working on the National List to ensure that all dances listed on it the music is readily available. The closure of Palomino Records and the destruction of their 45 records has created a problem.
- Ensuring that our members are well aware of the copyright laws and the illegal use of borrowed music.
- Support of our leaders in helping them as much as we can so that this wonderful activity of which we are a part continues and hopefully grows.

I would also like to thank and congratulate those Australian cuers/dancers who wrote dances, especially for this convention to follow its theme. This includes our Wednesday night dances, our Showcase nominations and our Experimental nominations.

In closing I would like to thank our Committee and also thank the committee of the 57th ANSDC for allowing us to utilize the time when this venue (Sunshine Dance Centre) was not being used during the convention.

And last but by no means least I would like to thank firstly the Queensland Round Dance Association for the financial support in bringing to Australia Randy and Marie Preskitt from the USA and then I would like to thank Randy and Marie for the fabulous and educational sessions that they have conducted at both the Caller Cuer Conference and at this National. I am sure a lot has been learned and our enthusiasm has been heightened.

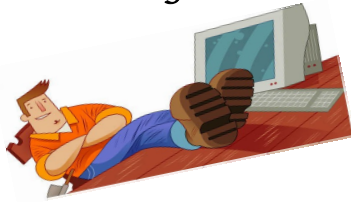

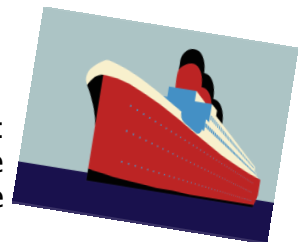

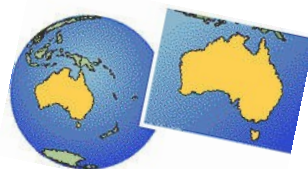

Common criteria for both categories:

- Music must be readily available (quote music name / artist / source)
- The dance has not been selected by another State/Territory
- The dance has not been used previously as a Showcase or Experimental
- A full cue sheet is required (Available on request)

Showcase Criteria:

- Dance level: Phase III or below
- Dance rhythm: Two Step, Waltz, Cha Cha, Rumba or Foxtrot

Experimental criteria:

- Dance level: Phase III+ to Phase IV+2
- The dance must contain at least 1 (and not more than 3) new movements not already in a dance on the National List

Dances received will be reviewed by Ed & Helen with a reduced number selected to be cued during the afternoon matinee by Paula. Dancers in attendance will be given a voting card to complete & return prior to the conclusion of the matinee. In the case of a 'tie' vote, Helen/Ed will make the final decision and submit dance details to ARDA.

DANCING - preventing injury

Dancing is simply moving in time to music. It's a fun and sociable way to exercise. We all know this, however do we all know how to prevent injury. Dancing makes demands on your bones and muscles. The most common dance related injuries involve the foot, ankle and lower back. Sprains and strains ... Muscles and ligaments can be overstretched or twisted. The knee and ankle are particularly vulnerable.

Warm up your muscles BEFORE and AFTER you dance.

Constitution Update

The final draft copies of the Constitution (v3), By-Laws (v3), Standing Orders (v1) and Glossary (v1) have been sent out for your perusal.

My plan is to table them at the upcoming ARDA AGM in Bendigo (58th ANSDC) for further comment and suggestions so that a final version can be sent to members for voting on at the ARDA AGM in Perth (59th ANSDC)

Unfortunately, there has been little feedback from members which has been disappointing.

Realise that these are the documents which will guide ARDA for future years.

Under the existing constitution, there needs to be at least 9 (nine) signatures from at least 3 (three) states signing the notice of motion. This notice of motion needs to be in the hands of the ARDA Secretary at least 3 (three) months prior to the meeting (AGM) and in the hands of members at least 2 (two) months prior to the meeting.

This motion to be moved will be as follows:

'TO RESCIND THE EXISTING DOCUMENTS (CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS, STANDING ORDERS AND GLOSSARY OF TERMS - CURRENT 2008) AND ADOPT THE PROPOSED DOCUMENTS (DRAFTS FINAL) AS THE NEW CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS, STANDING ORDERS AND GLOSSARY OF TERMS FOR THE OPERATION OF ARDA.'

For this motion to succeed and adopt the new documents, there will need to be at least **75% majority**.

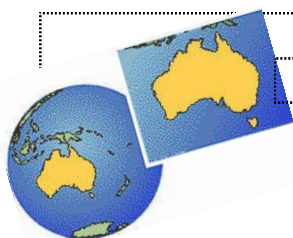

WHAT IS A VIEWING CIRCLE?

A 'viewing circle' is formed when round dance movements/actions, etc. are being taught and demonstrated.

ALL DANCERS PARTICIPATING IN THE TEACH SESSION are to clear the dance area ie. move well away from the centre of the hall and stand with the shorter of the couple in the front., whilst teachers demonstrate movements. Of course, if you are a 'shadow' dancer you only have to move back—no decision as to who is shorter! Keep the centre of the circle CLEAR.

WHY YOU MAY ASK?

Every person participating in the teach session or watching the teach session should be given the courtesy of being able to see what is being taught. We ask you ALL to do this as a matter of courtesy to your fellow dancers; those watching; and in particular to the teachers. The teachers need to be able to demonstrate the movement/actions from several points of the hall. We ALL want to be able to see. We ALL want plenty of oxygen. Be mindful also of the 'shadow/solo' dancer ... They have the same right to be on the dance floor.

QUESTIONS

The teachers will invite you to ask questions. Raise your hand and wait patiently for the teachers to identify you have a question to ask.

CONVERSATIONS

Last one and an important part of the 'viewing circle'. PLEASE DON'T HAVE A CHAT WHILE THE TEACHERS ARE TEACHING OR EXPLAINING A MOVEMENT to SOMEONE.

It is not only a distraction to the teachers but also to your fellow dancers. ARDA invites EVERYONE to take advantage of the teach sessions and sincerely hopes you leave with more knowledge than you had when you came through the door.
