CREAMY BAILEYS AND MASCARPONE DIP from www.taste.com.au/recipes

250 grms cream cheese, softened

2 tablespoons brown sugar

2 teaspoons vanilla extract,

1/3 cup Baileys Irish Cream

250 grms Mascarpone

Grated dark chocolate to decorate

Mixed berries, to serve

Apple wedges, to serve

Almond bread, to serve

Using an electric mixer, beat cream cheese, tablespoon sugar and vanilla extract until light and fluffy. Add Baileys. Beat until just combined. Fold in Mascarpone.

Spoon into a serving bowl. Sprinkle with remaining sugar and grated chocolate. Serve with fruit and almond bread for dipping.

The following article was sent to ALL ROUNDALAB members. With permission of the author, Sharon Parker, General Chairman this information is being provided to ALL. It is important and requires the attention of all. The original article was saved in a format I was unable to insert into this Newsletter and therefore it is not on the ROUNDALAB letterhead.

Topic: Copyrights and Ethics

November 2018

Hello ROUNDALAB members,

During this past year ROUNDALAB has been presented some items for concern.

These concerns involve the ethical behaviour of a few of our members. This is a topic that our Board of Directors felt needed to be shared with our entire membership.

Our educational materials (standards, manuals, videos, etc.) are all copyrighted materials. These items are ROUNDALAB property and are provided for our members knowledge and personal use. Our ROUNDALAB materials are there for the benefit of our members. The years of volunteer time and effort put into the creation of these materials was donated by each and every member of ROUNDALAB whom have served on a committee. We do provide a way for non-members to obtain many of our materials. This is through a subscription program or purchasing the items.

The ethics issues that have arisen are:

1. Our videos were being given away by someone who had purchased the items. They were making copies and telling the person receiving these videos, ROUNDALAB was giving them away. This is not true. Without the income from the sales of these videos ROUNDALAB would not be able to go back into the studio to film new figures, film figure updates, or create new products. Our videos are available through our on-line catalog or the ROUNDALAB office.
2. Our Manuals (e.g. Teaching Progression, Manual for New Round Dance Leaders, etc.) were being printed and given away. These manuals can be purchased through the office if you wish to provide a non-member a physical copy. It is through these purchases we help to defray the expenses from the committee and some office costs. Please do not print and give away any of our manuals.
3. Our Standards manuals were being printed and given to dancers. Again, these are available to our members through our website. Dancers can be directed to go to our web-page catalog or call the office to purchase a subscription.
4. Members have been posting our ROUNDALAB manuals onto their own web-sites. Members are encouraged to download these manuals to their computer for their personal use, but they should not post them to theirs or other's sites.
5. Members are sharing their ROUNDALAB website passcode with non-members. These pass codes are for members use only. It gives our members access to all our manuals and materials we have published online. As stated in #2 & #3 above these materials are available in our online catalog or through the ROUNDALAB office.
6. Members have been giving away digital copies of music. We all must strive to own each piece of music we use. If you want to 'share' a piece of music, purchase a copy and through the web site (Amazon, iTunes, etc.) 'gift' the music within the purchasing process. Please look at the Guild of Pride (www.guildofpride.org) for information on why we should own our own copy of music.
7. We have some members using other leaders recorded cues for dances and events without the cuers permission for use. Please get permission from a leader if you are wanting to use their recorded cueing skills at your events.

Each of the above items involve a poor choice of behaviour. Many of the above items cut into the income of ROUNDALAB. By giving away these items you are making it more difficult for ROUNDALAB to cover the costs of the upkeep of these items and the creation of new items.

And remember, all Round Dance Leaders working within the United States should have a license from ASCAP, BMI, and SESAC before performing music in a public venue (a dance is a public venue). If there is a leader in your area who is not a member of ROUNDALAB, please encourage them to reach out to our office and take the steps needed to join our organization. By doing so, they will have access to the items I spoke of above, all three music performance licenses, and the support and comradery of our ROUNDALAB members.

VIENNA ah VIENNA

Helen and I wanted to dance in Vienna as she had been unable to do so on her last trip to Europe to see her uncle and aunt. So a search on the European square dance website found a number of clubs in Vienna and even more fortuitously, a teaching weekend with Ilona & Stefan Lankutis from Germany.

Chris emailed the clubs and was offered accommodation with one of the dancers in the flat above her unit and basement dance floor. Once confirmed, Chris organised the train from Budapest and, to travel back a different way, bus from Vienna to Budapest. The only think was to find one's way round Vienna on the underground as Anita's flat was about half an hour from some of the dance venues in the city - this proved surprisingly easy.

First mistake for Chris was to catch the train from the 'wrong station' in Budapest (Kelenfold and should have been Keleti). Luckily, the train did stop where we were and so headed off to Vienna. Passports were checked at the border and once in Austria, the numbers of wind turbines increased rapidly. On our arrival, we sorted out the underground and headed off to Anita's, who kindly picked us up from the station and saved us a walk. A bit of shopping and then we had to get ready for square dancing down-stairs with her club 'Dancing Strawberries'. They do not have a resident caller but had visiting caller—David Dvorak—from Prague who was there for the weekend. It was a terrific evening even if I was the only male dancing.

Saturday morning saw us off to the city for rounds, the weekend being organised by 'The Work Shoppers' who do both squares and rounds. The first dance Ilona & Stefan taught was a Ph V Waltz called 'Pi's Lullaby' using the theme song from the movie 'Life of Pi', a beautiful dance to a beautiful piece of music. The dance could be easily taught as an experimental in possibly half an hour. We were treated to a short drive around parts of Vienna and then dinner at a 'hostelhaus'.

These are restaurants who sell only their own wine with your meal, which you select a bit like a buffet.



Sunday saw us tackle a West Coast Swing that Ilona and Sefan had written - 'Dirty Low Down and Bad'. This is not a rhythm danced very often in Australia and would be much more of a challenge than Saturday's waltz. Still we eventually got there and the dance has improved both our understanding and appreciation of the rhythm. Chris openly admitted to not liking the rhythm, but this dance has helped him enormously see that it can be fun.

Monday allowed us some sight-seeing time and we discovered Vienna's equivalent to David Jones. We had coffee and lunch in their top floor restaurant and got a magnificent view of the nearby church's roof - so fancily decorated. A quick trip back to Anita's for a snack and change of clothes before heading out to square dancing again with 'Vienna Swingers'. This club has its resident caller and there were two visiting lady callers from Germany who were also staying at Anita's. So we came home with them, which saved us the walk from the station.



Tuesday morning we headed back into the city for our return bus trip. Not a very nice spot to catch the bus from, but we left on time and only had one stop, Györ, before reaching Budapest.

We enjoyed two evening meals at a pub round the corner from our unit in Budapest. Called the 'For Sale Pub', we were greeted by straw on the floor and peanuts on the table, the idea being to toss your shells on the floor. Meals were massive and the goulash soup was much more than an entree - one litre of soup!!!! Helen's side salad on the second night was served in a glass bowl easily a foot in diameter and able to serve 20 people easily. It has a serious fire issue as the paper placemats are placed on the walls and ceilings with comments. Still, highly recommended.


