Review of the NDL cue sheets is progressing well and once completed will be posted on the ARDA website with the following notation at the bottom of the page:

FINAL (MONTH) 2024.

Revised versions are noted with the released date information.

There is continuing discussion regarding a members-only section on the website, much like RAL have which would permit documents to be available to members only.

Any suggestions as to which documents should be in this area will be greatly received and appreciated.

Another aim is to have the membership renewal form designed so it can be completed online, rather than the current method where it has to be filled out and/or corrected, scanned and then emailed back to the Secretary. Stay tuned!!

To assist State associations hosting dance/teach weekends, ARDA has offered to provide a donation, the proviso being a reduction on the cost of registration for the weekend to ARDA members. Hopefully, it will also encourage ARDA members to travel to both their own State function as well as the scheduled interstate functions; currently, Queensland, South Australia and Victoria host functions and these are usually at different times of the year.

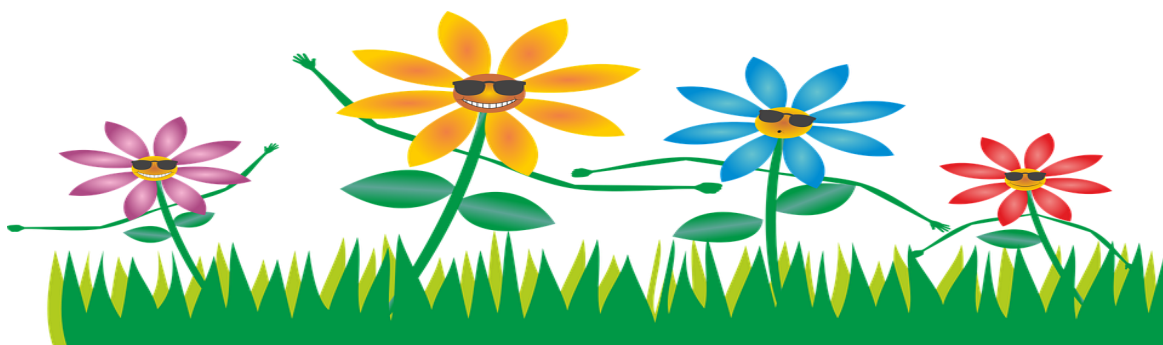


From The Editor
